The USDA's Farm to School program encourages school districts to bring locally produced foods into school cafeterias; make available hands-on learning activities such as school gardening, farm visits, and culinary classes; and integrate food-related education into the regular classroom curriculum.

Every year, grants are awarded to help schools connect with local producers and teach students where their food comes from.
