# FARM TO SCHOOL

The USDA's Farm to School program encourages school districts to bring locally produced foods into school cafeterias; make available hands-on learning activities such as school gardening, farm visits, and culinary classes; and integrate food-related education into the regular classroom curriculum.

## 3 Farm to School Must Haves

#### Procurement:

local foods are purchased, promoted, and served for lunch or snack or as a taste-test.

### School Garden:

students engage in hands-on learning through gardening.

#### Education:

educational activities related to agriculture, food, health, or nutrition are offered to students.
